Dear Mr. Murray:

On July 14, 2026, the Ontario Energy Board ("OEB" or the "Board") issued its *Filing Requirements for Electricity Distribution Rate Applications – for 2027 Rate Applications, Chapter 3 for Incentive Rate-Setting Applications*. Accordingly, Enova Power Corp. (the "Applicant" or "Enova") submits its 2027 Distribution Rate Application for rates effective January 1, 2027. All procedures and filing requirements as outlined in the Board's IRM Report and subsequent filing guidelines were followed in the preparation of this submission and in the development of the adjusted rates, utilizing the Board's models as required. In addition to the relief sought herein, Enova Power is also filing an Incremental Capital Module ("ICM") as part of this application.

Enova's submission, which has been electronically filed through the Board's web portal, includes the Cover Letter, Manager's Summary, completed copies of the 2027 IRM Rate Generator and the Commodity Analysis Workform, for both the Kitchener-Wilmot Rate Zone (KWRZ) and the Waterloo North Rate Zone (WNRZ) as well as the live Excel versions. Enova's current and proposed Tariff Sheets and the 2027 filing checklist are also included. The ACM/ICM rate models for Kitchener-Wilmot Rate Zone (KWRZ) and the Waterloo North Rate Zone (WNRZ) have been included in this submission.

As a result of adjustments made by the 2027 IRM Rate Generators and the proposed rate rider for the ICM, subject to adjustments to be made by Board staff as required, the

estimated bill impact for KWRZ Residential customers consuming 750 kWh per month would result in a decrease in the total bill of (0.10)% or (\$0.12). A General Service<50 kW, 2000 kWh per month customer would experience a decrease of (0.27)% or (\$0.90). The estimated bill impact for WNRZ Residential customers consuming 750 kWh per month would result in an increase in the total bill of 0.30% or \$0.41. A General Service<50 kW, 2000 kWh per month customer would experience a decrease of (0.02)% or (\$0.06).

Enova is requesting the adjusted rates be approved for implementation on January 1, 2027. Consumption will be pro-rated with pre-January 1st consumption at the existing rates and post-January 1st consumption at the new rates.

Application

1. The Applicant is Enova Power Corp. ("Enova"). Enova is incorporated pursuant to the Ontario Business Corporations Act with its head office in the City of Kitchener, Ontario. Enova distributes electricity within the Cities of Kitchener and Waterloo and the Townships of Wilmot, Woolwich and Wellesley.
2. In a Decision and Order in Enova's Mergers, Acquisitions, Amalgamations and Divestitures ("MAADs") Application (EB-2022-0006) received June 28, 2022, the Ontario Energy Board ("OEB" or "Board") granted approval for Enova to merge the operations of Kitchener-Wilmot Hydro Inc. ("KWHI") and Waterloo North Hydro Inc. ("WNHI"). The amalgamation was effective September 1, 2022. Enova has been granted a 10-year deferred rebasing period. This is accomplished by maintaining two rate zones – the KWHI rate zone ("KWRZ") and the WNHI rate zone ("WNRZ") - until rates are rebased.
3. Enova hereby applies to the OEB for an order or orders made pursuant to Section 78 of the Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998, as amended (the "OEB Act"), approving just and reasonable rates for the distribution of electricity based on the Renewed Regulatory Framework for Electricity using the Price Cap Incentive Rate-setting method.
4. Specifically, Enova hereby applies for an order or orders granting distribution rates updated and adjusted in accordance with Chapter 3 of the *Filing Requirements for Electricity Distribution Rate Applications* updated July 14, 2026 ("Filing Requirements"), including the following:
 - a. An adjustment to Enova's existing distribution rates in both rates zones calculated by the OEB's inflation factor less the productivity factor and stretch factor;
 - b. An adjustment to the retail transmission service rates in both rate zones as provided in the OEB's *Guideline G-2008-0001: Electricity Distribution*

Retail Transmission Service Rates (RTSR), Revision 4.0 dated June 28, 2012;

- c. Disposition of its Group 1 Deferral and Variance accounts for both rate zones;
 - d. An adjustment to the Low Voltage Service Rates in the WNRZ;
 - e. To adjust the interim RTSR Network and RTSR Connection rate for Large User rate class;
- 5. Enova Power Corp hereby applies to the Ontario Energy Board (“OEB”) pursuant to section 78 of the Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998, as amended (the “OEB Act”), for orders approving Incremental Capital Module (“ICM”) funding through distribution rate riders effective January 1, 2027 through to Enova’s next re-basing, planned for 2033 rates.
 - 6. This Application is supported by written evidence that may be amended from time to time, prior to the Board's final Decision on this Application.
 - 7. In the event that, the Board is unable to provide a Decision and Order in this Application for implementation by the Applicant as of January 1, 2027, Enova requests that the Board issue an Interim Rate Order declaring the current Distribution Rates and Specific Service Charges as interim until the decided implementation date of the approved 2027 distribution rates.
 - 8. In the event that, the effective date does not coincide with the Board’s decided implementation date for 2027 distribution rates and charges, Enova requests permission to recover the incremental revenue from the effective date to the implementation date.
 - 9. The Applicant requests that, pursuant to Section 34.01 of the Board’s Rules of Practice and Procedure, this proceeding be conducted by way of written hearing.

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Introduction

Enova Power Corp. (“Enova”) (License No. ED-2022-0006) distributes electricity to approximately 165,000 customers within the Cities of Kitchener and Waterloo (primarily urban) and the Townships of Wilmot, Wellesley and Woolwich (primarily rural).

The primary contact for the Application is:

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All ratepayers within Enova’s service territory will be affected by this Application. This Application can be viewed on Enova’s website at enovapower.com.

Enova has used the 2027 IRM Rate Generator (version 2.0) for this Application. Each rate zone has its own IRM Rate Generator. Enova reviewed the pre-populated Rate Generator models, attached as Appendices C and D for accuracy.

The Rate Generators and Commodity Accounts Analysis Workforms for each rate zone have been submitted in live Excel versions.

Enova is requesting clearance of its Group 1 Deferral and Variance account balances. As per filing instruction section 3.2.5, Enova will also be applying for a change to its Low Voltage Service rates in its WNRZ service territory.

Summary of Application

Annual Adjustment Mechanism

Enova has used the 2027 rate-setting parameters (3.0% Price Escalator, Stretch Factor 0.30% and Productivity Factor of 0.0%) as set out in the June 11, 2026, letter issued by the OEB. Proposed distribution rates are as per Table 1 below:

The annual adjustment mechanism will not be applied to the following rate components:

- Rate Riders
- Rate Adders
- Low Voltage Service Charges
- Retail Transmission Service Rates
- Wholesale Market Service Rate
- Rural and Remote Rate Protection Benefit and Charge
- Standard Supply Service – Administrative Charge
- Capacity Based Recovery
- MicroFIT Service Charge

- Specific Service Charges
- Transformation and Primary Metering Allowances
- Smart Metering Entity Charge

Enova is not seeking relief for any of the excluded items listed in Section 3.2.1.1 of the *Filing Requirements for Electricity Distribution Rate Applications* dated July 14, 2026.

Proposed Tariff of Rates and Charges

Included in both Rate Generator files is a detailed listing of Enova's 2027 proposed rates and charges. The listing has been included in this Application as Appendix G – Proposed Tariffs - KWRZ and Appendix H – Proposed Tariffs - WNRZ. Enova has included a .pdf copy of its current tariff sheets (2026 rates) as Appendix A – Current Tariffs – KWRZ and Appendix B – Current Tariffs - WNRZ, as required by the Board Filing Guidelines.

Summary Bill Impacts

Enova has used the 2027 IRM Rate Generators to calculate the bill impacts by rate class, holding the commodity rates and regulatory charges constant. Table 2 presents the total bill impact including proposed ICM rate rider and after OER and sales taxes for by rate classes:

* The proposed Large User RTSR Network or RTSR Connection rate have been included in the Bill Impact analysis.

Enova proposes that no rate mitigation is necessary.

Revenue-to-Cost Ratio Adjustments

The Revenue-to-Cost ratios applied for in KWHI's last filed Cost of Service Application (EB-2019-0049) are within the Board specified target ranges.

Per WNH's 2021 Cost of Service Rate Application, EB-2020-0059 Settlement Proposal page 31 of 43, "WNH agrees to adjust its rate design proposal for all classes, except the residential class, such that the 2020 fixed rate will be maintained in 2021 if it is otherwise above the Minimum System plus PLCC level...WNH further agrees to not adjust any fixed charge that is above the Minimum System plus PLCC level for all classes except the residential class during the subsequent IRM period, and shall for those classes instead propose to the OEB to collect all IRM rate increases through the variable portion of the charges applicable to each affected class. For clarity, WNH is still eligible to obtain on hundred percent (100%) of the value of all IRM rate increases through the variable portion of the charges applicable to each affected class."

Enova has detailed in Table 3 how it estimated the rate increase from 2026 rates to 2027 rates. The customer/connections and kWh and kW are based on 2025 actual values.

Enova has included the adjustments in the WNRZ rate generator on Tab 17.Rev2Cost_GDPIPI.

Retail Transmission Service Rates

The Board's Revision 4.0 to *Guideline G-2008-0001 – Electricity Distribution Retail Transmission Service Rates* ("RTSRs") was issued June 28, 2012. Based on the most recent Decision and Rate Order of the Board (EB-2025-0232), new Uniform Transmission Rates ("UTRs") were implemented January 1, 2026, and are as follows:

- Network Service Rate of \$6.39 per kW; and
- Line Connection Service Rate of \$1.03 per kW; and
- Transformation Connection Service Rate of \$3.47 per kW

The Applicant passes on these UTR charges through two (2) RTSRs. These retail transmission rates are as follows:

- Retail Transmission Rate – Network Service Rate
- Retail Transmission Rate – Line and Transformation Connection Service Rate

Enova has populated the 2027 IRM Rate Generator models with the requested historical data.

In Sheets 11 and 12 of the 2027 IRM Rate Generator model for Enova (WNRZ), information for two additional Host Distributors has been included. The first Host Distributor listed is Enova (KWRZ) and the second Host Distributor is GrandBridge Energy.

The proposed RTSRs were determined in the 2027 IRM Rate Generators and are listed in Table 4 below:

All GS>50 customers in the WNRZ are interval metered as of August 2020; therefore, there are no proposed RTSR Network or RTSR Connection rates associated with rate class General Service 50 to 999 kW, non-interval.

* Enova is seeking approval to adjust the RTSR Network or RTSR Connection rate for the Large User rate class within the KWRZ. In 2023, the sole Large User in this rate zone transitioned to the GS>50 class, resulting in no consumption or demand being allocated to the Large User class in 2024-2025. Consequently, no RTSR Network or RTSR Connection rates were included in the 2027 tariff.

To prepare for the potential return of a Large User customer, Enova proposes adding a placeholder rate to the tariff. This rate would be based on the 2025 values, plus the proposed percentage increase or decrease in RTSR Network or RTSR Connection rates for the General Service 50 to 999 kW class. Please refer to Table 4 A below details. Enova believes it is prudent to maintain a rate on the tariff sheet in the event of a large use customer return.

If this proposal is approved, Enova requests that the IRM Model be updated accordingly to ensure the rate is reflected in both the Tariff and Bill Impact worksheets.

Enova notes that if any changes to the models are required as a result of issuing UTR adjustments, Board Staff will incorporate the changes, and Enova will have an opportunity to comment on the accuracy.

Deferral and Variance Accounts

The threshold test has been met. Enova is requesting disposition of its Group 1 Deferral and Variance account balances in both rate zones. Enova is proposing to dispose of the balances by

means of a rate rider of one year. The total claim in the KWRZ is (\$4,713,746) and is displayed in Table 5 below:

Continuity Schedule

Enova has populated the worksheet 3, *Continuity Schedule* of the 2027 IRM Rate Generators with its data. Enova can confirm the accuracy of the prepopulated data on worksheet 4. *Billing Det. For Def-Var.*

No adjustments have been made to balances previously approved by the OEB for disposition.

Projected carrying charges for 2026 have been calculated using the prescribed interest rates as released by the Board using December 31, 2025 audited balances.

The ending balances of Group 1 accounts agree with the amounts reported to the Board through Enova's RRR 2.1.7 with the following exceptions:

- In the KWRZ Rate Generator, Account 1588 – RSVA - Power, Column BF shows the adjustment as per the May 23rd, 2017, letter *Guidance on Disposition of Accounts 1588 and 1589*. Column BF includes the reversal of prior year principal adjustments of \$2,287,432 and current year principal adjustments of (\$2,028,894).
- In the KWRZ Rate Generator, Account 1589 – RSVA Global Adjustment (GA) Column BF shows the adjustment as per the May 23rd, 2017, letter *Guidance on Disposition of Accounts 1588 and 1589*. Column BF includes the reversal prior year principal adjustments of \$133,941 and current year adjustments of (\$25,591).
- In the WNRZ Rate Generator, Account 1588 – RSVA - Power, Column BF shows the adjustment as per the May 23rd, 2017, letter *Guidance on Disposition of Accounts 1588 and 1589*. Column BF includes the reversal of prior year principal adjustments of \$350,495 and current year adjustments of (\$1,764,112).
- In the WNRZ Rate Generator, Account 1589 – RSVA Global Adjustment (GA) Column BF shows the adjustment as per the May 23rd, 2017, letter *Guidance on Disposition of Accounts 1588 and 1589*. Column BF includes the reversal of prior year principal adjustments of \$357,466 and current year adjustments of (\$31,517).

Account 1595

Residual balances in Account 1595 for both rate zones for 2023 have not previously been brought forward for disposition. The rate rider for the recovery of 2023 balances expired December 31, 2023.

Wholesale Market Participants

Enova has nine (9) Wholesale Market Participants. No Wholesale Market Participant has been allocated balances from 1580, 1588 or 1589.

Global Adjustment

The rate rider calculated for non-RPP customers for the disposition of the GA balance is in kWh. The rate rider applies only to Class B non-RPP customers.

Enova - KWRZ had one (1) customer transition from Class A to Class B in the period when the GA balance accumulated and two (2) customers transition from Class B to Class A in the same period.

Enova - WNRZ had two (2) customers transition from Class A to Class B in the period when the GA balance accumulated three (3) customers transitions from Class B to Class A in the period when the GA balance accumulated.

Enova has filled out the transition worksheets for these customers and has allocated a GA variance amount to each.

Commodity Accounts Analysis Workform

Enova has completed version 1.0 of the Commodity Accounts Analysis Workform for each rate zone for the year 2025. The analysis shows that the balances in Account 1589 for both rate zones are reasonable with less than a one percent variance for 2025. Balances to December 31, 2024 have been disposed as final in Enova's 2026 IRM Applications EB-2025-0045.

Enova performed the reasonability test for account 1588 that is included as part of the Commodity Accounts Analysis Workform. The balance in Account 1588 for both rate zones is reasonable.

Enova has fully implemented the OEB's February 21, 2019, Accounting Guidance for Account 1588 and 1589 effective January 1, 2019.

Capacity Based Recovery (CBR)

Enova KWRZ and Enova WNRZ last disposed of their balances in the CBR Class B sub account in 2024. For both rate zones, Enova is proposing to dispose of the balance in its Account 1580 sub account CBR as per OEB's Accounting Guidance. There is no balance in Account 1580 Sub account CBR Class A.

Enova served Class A customers in the time that CBR Class B balances accumulated. Enova has filled in the 2027 Rate Generators for customers who transitioned between Class A and Class B in the year 2025. A portion of the CBR balance has been allocated to these customers. A rate rider has been calculated for the remaining rate classes.

Low Voltage Service Rates

Customers in the WNRZ are charged Low Voltage Rates. The IRM rate generator for WNRZ includes actual volumes and rates for 2025 for each host distributor. Allocation of the Low Voltage charges to the rate classes is as per the rate generator and allocated based on the proportion of transmission connection rate revenues. Table 8 below presents the 2026 LV rates and the proposed rates for 2027.

The significant variances can be explained as follows: In 2022, Enova (KWHRZ) had a large rate rider for recovery of its RTSR charges, resulting in the increase. In 2023, GrandBridge had an 8% increase in variable rate; Hydro One had a 17% reduction in kW consumption; and Enova (KWHRZ) had a 23% reduction in variable rates compared to 2022. In 2024, GrandBridge had a 14% decrease in variable rate and a 1% increase in kW resulting in 13% less total costs. Hydro One had a 6%

increase in kW and a 15% increase in variable rate resulting in 17% more costs. Enova (KWHZR) had a 2% reduction in variable rates and a 5% increase in kW resulting in a 2% increase in cost. In 2025, GrandBridge had a 9% increase in variable rate and a 4% decrease in kW resulting in 5% increase in total costs. Hydro One had a 4% decrease in kW and a 40% decrease in variable rate resulting in 22% less costs. Enova (KWHZR) had a 6% reduction in variable rates while kW remained approximately the same resulting in a 6% decrease in cost.

Other

Application of Tax Change

As part of the KWRZ 2020 Cost of Service Rate Application (EB-2019-0049), Enova's PILs workform showed no taxes payable. There has been no change to tax rates and there is no calculated Sharing of Tax Change amount.

In WNRZ's 2021 Cost of Service Rate Application (EB-2020-0059), Account 1592 balances related to Bill C-97 Accelerated Incentive Program (AIP) for 2019 and 2020 were approved on a final basis. Enova WNRZ included the current AIP factor of 1.5X in the approved PILs model for 2021 and therefore no balances are anticipated to arise in Account 1592 until the wind-down of the AIP begins.

The OEB's letter on May 6, 2026, regarding Bill C-15 confirms that the Reaccelerated Investment Incentive (RII) and related accelerated CCA changes will continue to be treated in accordance with the OEB's July 25, 2019 letter on Bill C-97.

The tax benefits arising from accelerated CCA that are not reflected in existing rates are to be tracked in Account 1592 – PILs and Tax Variances, CCA Changes. These amounts will be subject to review and disposition by the OEB through the utility's future rebasing process.

Enova will calculate the revenue requirement impact of the RII and future CCA rule change and record the amounts in Account 1592- PILS and Tax Variance.

Z Factor Claims

Enova is not making a Z – factor claim with this Rate Application.

Off-ramps

Enova's distribution earnings are within the dead band of +/- 300 basis points versus its OEB approved return on equity. For this reason, Enova is applying for an increase in its base rates.

Elements specific to the Price Cap IR Plan

In addition to the relief sought herein, Enova Power Corp has capital investment needs that are not funded through existing distribution rates and hereby applies to the Ontario Energy Board pursuant to section 78 of the Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998, as amended (the "OEB Act"), for orders approving Incremental Capital Module ("ICM") funding through distribution rate riders effective January 1, 2027 through to Enova's next re-basing, planned for 2033 rates.

Enova Power is requesting ICM Approval to fund the investment in a new Heating, Ventilation and Air conditioning ("HVAC") system, comprehensive interior renovations, and improved accessibility to the customer service centre at its Victoria Street property (jointly called "Facility Renovation"), with an in-service date in Q2 2027. Enova Power is seeking approval for incremental capital funding for the Facility Renovation at a projected cost of \$12.98M, with an annual incremental capital revenue requirement of \$1.27M. Presented below are the bill impacts by rate class of the proposed ICM rate application.

As the Board is aware, Enova Power is required to file a Distribution System Plan (“**DSP**”) together with its ICM. As a result of the fact that this is Enova Power’s first DSP following the merger of Kitchener-Wilmot Hydro Inc. and Waterloo North Hydro Inc., completion of the DSP has taken longer than anticipated. As a result, it is not in a position to file the DSP along with the rest of this application. It intends to file the materials related to the DSP by the end of September 2026. Enova Power acknowledges that if the proceeding were not bifurcated, the filing date of the ICM materials could impact the Board’s ability to set rates effective January 1, 2027.

Accordingly, Enova Power requests that the Board:

- accept both the IRM and ICM related requests for relief as part of one proceeding; and
- bifurcate the proceeding pursuant to Rule 4.01 of the Ontario Energy Board’s Rules of Practice and Procedure¹ such that the IRM related issues are heard as part of Phase 1 of this proceeding, and the ICM related issues are held in abeyance and heard as Phase 2 of this proceeding.

As a result, the IRM related requests could be adjudicated in time for an effective date of January 1, 2027, and the ICM related requests could follow.

The Board has often bifurcated proceedings, including where the effective date of an IRM application might be impacted by other requested relief. In this regard:

- In EB-2022-0024, the Board bifurcated Elexicon Energy Inc.’s IRM application into two phases. Phase 1 dealt with the “relatively mechanistic” IRM portion of the application, and Phase 2 dealt with complex ICM portion of the application.²
- In EB-2021-0015, the Board suggested that it may have to bifurcate Elexicon Energy Inc.’s IRM application if it determined that it could not render a decision prior to January 1, 2022, the start of Elexicon’s rate making year.³
- In EB-2024-0015, the Board bifurcated E.L.K.’s IRM application in order to separate a discrete issue with two accounts from the main proceeding.⁴

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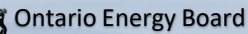

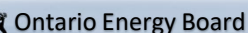

2027 Incremental Capital Module

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Overview

Enova Power Corp (“Enova Power”) has capital investment needs that are not funded through existing distribution rates and hereby applies to the Ontario Energy Board (“OEB”) pursuant to section 78 of the Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998, as amended (the “OEB Act”), for orders approving Incremental Capital Module (“ICM”) funding through distribution rate riders effective January 1, 2027, through to Enova’s next re-basing, planned for 2033 rates.

Enova Power is requesting ICM Approval to fund the investment in a new Heating, Ventilation and Airconditioning (“HVAC”) system, comprehensive interior renovations, and improved accessibility to the customer service centre at its Victoria Street property (jointly called “Facility Renovation”), with an in-service date in Q2 2027. Enova Power is seeking approval for incremental capital funding for the Facility Renovation at a projected cost of \$12.98M, with an annual incremental capital revenue requirement of \$1.27M.

Enova Power submits that the Facility Renovation meets the OEB’s 3-Part ICM Test of Materiality, Need, and Prudence. As such, Enova Power requests the OEB approve ICM Funding for the Facility Renovation as filed. Enova Power has completed OEB ICM Models for each of its Kitchener-Wilmot Hydro Rate Zone (“KWRZ”) and Waterloo North Hydro Rate Zone (“WNRZ”) rate zones, allocating the capital cost of the Facility Renovation between the rate zones as further described in this evidence. Enova Power confirms the accuracy of the billing determinants entered into the models, which are consistent with those included within its IRM Models also attached to this application.

1. Background

1.1. Enova Energy Corporation

Enova Energy Corporation (“Enova Corp”) is an energy company with assets in municipal electricity distribution, electricity services, and renewable energy. It is owned by the City of Kitchener (53.39%), the City of Waterloo (30.83%), the Township of Woolwich (8.51%), the Township of Wilmot (4.49%), and the Township of Wellesley (2.78%).

Enova Corp's core asset is Enova Power Corp ("Enova Power"), a regulated local distribution company distributing electricity to 5 communities in southern Ontario. Enova Corp also owns and controls a group of competitive entities that provide a variety of solutions to customers in the utility, municipal, commercial, and industrial sectors. Enova Corp's competitive business units include Alliance Metering Solutions (sub-metering and billing services for utilities for multi-unit complexes and electric vehicle (EV) chargers and EV energy management systems for residential and multi-residential applications), Enova Energy Services (streetlight maintenance services), and Grand River Energy Solutions (energy transition project investor and developer that partners with public and private sector organizations to accelerate their facility and fleet decarbonization efforts).

1.2. Enova Power

Enova Power is a regulated electricity distribution company and a wholly owned subsidiary of Enova Corp, created by the merger of Kitchener-Wilmot Hydro Inc. ("KWHI") and Waterloo North Hydro Inc. ("WNHI"), effective September 1, 2022.¹ Enova has been granted a 10-year deferred rebasing period, accomplished by maintaining two rate zones – the KWHI rate zone and the WNHI rate zone – until rates are rebased in 2033.

Enova serves more than 165,000 residents and businesses in the City of Kitchener, the City of Waterloo, the Township of Wellesley, the Township of Wilmot and the Township of Woolwich. Enova Power's service territory stretches over 1,108 km² from the cities of Kitchener and Waterloo, the townships of Woolwich and Wellesley, and the towns of Wilmot and Centre Wellington (Figure 1). In these communities, Enova Power's diverse customer base ranges from residential and small business customers to large commercial and industrial users, including manufacturers, technology firms, healthcare institutions, and educational facilities. Enova Power is typically a summer electricity load peaking utility.

2 Enova Power's head office is located at 301 Victoria Street South Kitchener, ON (the "Victoria Street
3 Property"). This location has served as the main operations centre for one of Enova Power's legacy utilities
4 (Kitchener Wilmot Hydro) since 1982 and now serves as Enova Power's head office since its formation
5 through the merger completed in 2022.

6 **1.3. Enova Power MAADs (EB-2022-0006)**

7 The predecessor utilities to Enova Power indicated as part of the MAADs proceeding that, at that time,
8 they did not expect to file an ICM during the deferred rebasing period, explaining that it had both the
9 KWHI DSP (EB-2019-0049) and the WNHI DSP (EB-2020-0059) that covered the first portion of the
10 deferred rebasing period. However, the predecessors to Enova Power also expressly reserved the right
11 to revisit this determination as required throughout the deferred rebasing period.²
12 In this context, the OEB determined at Section 4.4.2 of its June 28, 2022 Decision and Order approving
13 the merger of the former Kitchener-Wilmot Hydro Inc. and Waterloo North Hydro Inc. (EB-2022-0006)
14 that:

1 *"The OEB finds that should LDC MergeCo file an ICM related to capital investment in LDC MergeCo's*
2 *distribution system beginning in 2025, regardless of which service area that ICM is for, it shall*
3 *concurrently file a consolidated DSP. While existing OEB policies do not stipulate a time frame for a*
4 *consolidated DSP, the OEB concludes that it is good utility practice as part of a consolidation to update*
5 *a DSP for the consolidated entity at the earliest opportunity to take advantage of the synergies that the*
6 *amalgamation presents. In the absence of a consolidated DSP, the OEB cannot determine if*
7 *incremental capital can be accommodated within the base rates for the predecessor distributors."*

8 2. Enova Power Facility Renovation

9 2.1. Victoria Street Property Overview

10 The Victoria Street Property comprises approximately 112,483 square feet (10,450 m²) of commercially
11 zoned land located in Kitchener, Ontario. The original property was built in 1982, with subsequent additions
12 completed in 1987 and further expansions carried out in 2003. It is a multi-purpose facility and is the
13 headquarters for Enova Power. The facility's uses include:

- 14 • **Main Office:** The main office includes various sub-types of space uses typical of offices (offices,
15 meeting rooms, computer serves rooms, washrooms, etc.). Approximately 100 full-time office staff
16 currently work out of the office on a regular basis, working typical 9-to-5 hours.
- 17 • **South Office Spaces:** The south office spaces refer to the group of conditioned spaces located
18 within the garage and to the south of the garage. These spaces include the stations and line
19 department office space, meter receiving and storage, washrooms and locker rooms, exercise and
20 auditorium spaces.
- 21 • **Warehouse:** This space is typically used for the storage of physical materials used in process
22 operations.
- 23 • **Garage:** The garage refers to the vehicle garage, used for vehicle maintenance and storage.

24 2.2. Challenges and Requirements

25 Following the merger, Enova Power continues to operate two significant office locations, one of which is
26 the Victoria Street Property.

27 Components of the Victoria Street Property have exceeded their useful lives and require investment to
28 maximize the utility's effectiveness and mitigate risk for employees and customers. Specifically, the Victoria
29 Street Property's HVAC system is well past its useful life and requires replacement as soon as practically
30 feasible. At the same time, the employee office space at the Victoria Street Property has not undergone

1 basic updating and renovation since 1987 resulting in a sub-optimal working environment for employees.
2 Finally, the Victoria Street Property is home to Enova Power's customer-facing customer service centre,
3 which (in addition to also requiring basic office updates) currently is compliant, but provides inconvenient
4 and sub-optimal access for customers with accessibility needs. A more readily accessible customer service
5 centre is required to meet expectations of sufficient accessibility for all Enova Power customers in a manner
6 that protects the dignity of those with accessibility needs.

7 The following sub-sections summarize the challenges and requirements identified at the Victoria Street
8 Property with respect to the HVAC system, office space conditions, and the customer service centre,
9 respectively.

10 **2.2.1.1. HVAC System**

11 The current Victoria Street Property HVAC system was installed 41 years ago and is well past its estimated
12 useful life of 20 to 25 years. The age and deteriorating effectiveness of the HVAC equipment has led to
13 inconsistent or inadequate temperature control, increased operational costs, and elevated risk of system
14 failure and business disruption. Below are pictures of the existing HVAC system.

1 The current HVAC system is increasingly incapable of delivering consistent temperature control to the
2 Victoria Street Property. Enova Power has documented instances of in-building temperatures well outside
3 of the acceptable range expected of office workers to execute their work. At best, inhospitable indoor
4 temperatures create a distraction for employees and impede their day-to-day operations, while also eroding
5 the positive employee experience required to attract and retain critical utility staff. At worst, this issue can
6 create business disruption, as was the case on June 23, 2025, when internal temperatures reached 36
7 degrees Celsius because of an unanticipated chiller failure and Enova Power was required to close the
8 customer entrance and send all office staff home. On average, there have been 1-2 events per year when
9 equipment failure contributed to extreme internal temperatures that forced the closure of the Victoria Street
10 office to employees and customers.

11 Advancements in HVAC technology over the past four decades have rendered this equipment outdated in
12 terms of energy efficiency and performance capabilities compared to newer models. Upgrading to modern,
13 energy-efficient systems creates the opportunity to reduce operating costs, with Enova Power forecasting
14 a reduction of approximately \$19k per year in energy costs by moving from its current HVAC system to the
15 proposed HVAC system.³ The inefficiency of the current natural gas fired HVAC system also results in the
16 creation of more Greenhouse Gas (“GHG”) emissions than are necessary to heat the Victoria Street
17 Property, which is inconsistent with Enova Power’s commitment to sustainability.

18 Most importantly, the age and condition of the current HVAC system create a heightened level of risk of
19 catastrophic system failure disabling the system’s capability to operate or be repaired. The full loss of
20 heating and cooling capabilities at the Victoria Street Property would significantly hinder Enova Power’s
21 ability to carry on normal operations and serve customers. This risk is compounded by the reality that the
22 timing of any such failure cannot be predicted and could coincide with a period of urgent utility work.

23 **2.2.1.2. Interior Conditions**

24 The Victoria Street Property’s interior design and infrastructure no longer meet the demands of a modern
25 utility workplace. The office was originally constructed and laid out to support a smaller workforce and a
26 different operating model. Since that time, Enova Power has experienced workforce growth and has
27 consolidated several key functions, such as Finance and Customer Service, into the Victoria Street location

1 to streamline operations and improve coordination. However, the physical workspace has not kept pace
2 with this evolution. The original layout, designed around smaller, siloed work units, does not support the
3 collaborative, flexible, and team-based workflows that are required today. As a result, the building's
4 infrastructure has become a constraint on both productivity and efficiency, limiting the value of Enova's
5 organizational effectiveness.

6 An example of this is the area where three superintendents' offices were in an open area. Frequently,
7 confidential or personal conversations with employees were held in hallways, stairwells and in vehicles.
8 Another example of the layout not meeting the demands of the workforce was two areas where open
9 workspaces were reconfigured to be private offices without addressing the employee comfort or air flow.
10 The result was offices not designed to provide comfort to the occupants. These offices were among those
11 who reported complaints of excessive temperatures and health effects from working in their offices. Even
12 those who had offices that were originally designed that way complained of the conditions and lack of
13 temperature control.

14 Another system that is at end of life is the Fire Panel. The repair of the system is no longer supported by
15 the vendor. Parts are no longer available, and upgrades or replacements were never performed to extend
16 the useful life of the system.

17 From a workplace experience perspective, the highly dated interior finishes, furniture, and overall design
18 are out of step with contemporary office standards. Employees today expect a modern, professional, and
19 ergonomic work environment that fosters focus, collaboration, and wellbeing. Instead, staff at Victoria
20 Street face an environment that is not optimized for larger teams, lacks adaptable spaces (such as breakout
21 areas, meeting rooms, or quiet zones), and reflects an outdated aesthetic. This not only reduces day-to-
22 day employee engagement but also creates challenges for talent attraction and retention in a competitive
23 labor market. New hires, particularly younger professionals, increasingly factor the quality of workplace
24 environments into their career decisions, and the Victoria Street Property falls short of expectations.

25 In addition, outdated building systems and infrastructure including lighting, HVAC, and IT/communications
26 cabling further undermine employee experience and operational efficiency. Limited natural light, inefficient
27 layouts, and aging systems can contribute to reduced comfort, higher utility costs, and lower overall morale.

28 Taken together, the deficiencies of the Victoria Street Property represent more than an aesthetic issue;
29 they are a barrier to unlocking the full potential of Enova Power's workforce. Without modernization, the

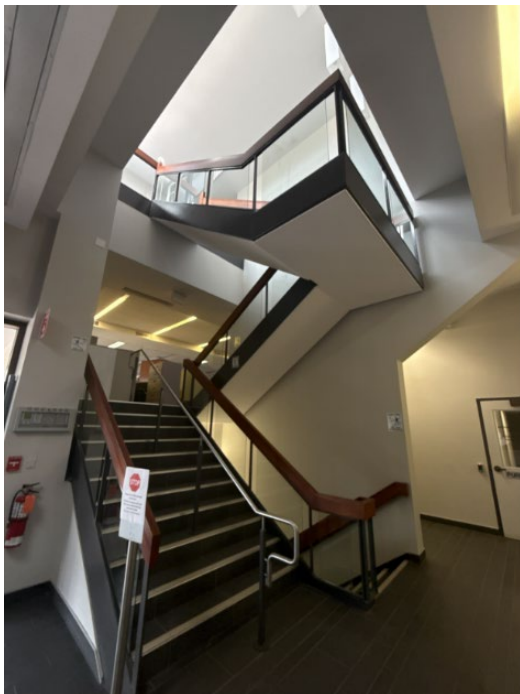
utility risks not only inefficiencies in current operations but also a growing disadvantage in retaining and recruiting top-tier talent for the future.

2.2.1.3. Accessibility Challenges

The Victoria Street customer service centre requires significant remodeling to improve accessibility, functionality, and overall customer experience. The Victoria Street customer centre receives on average more than 50 customers per day. On average more than 50 customers attend at the Victoria Street customer service centre per day.

One example of the challenges to customer access was a discrepancy in the stair riser heights. The steps leading to the level with the Customer Care service counters are different heights, which has lead to both customers and employees tripping up or down the steps. Another accessibility challenge relates to the distance a customer or employee with mobility issues must travel to access Customer Service. Customers with disabilities do not have equal opportunity as other customers as they must travel 25m further than others to gain access to the main customer entrance.

Figure 3: Main Stairs with Differing Riser Heights



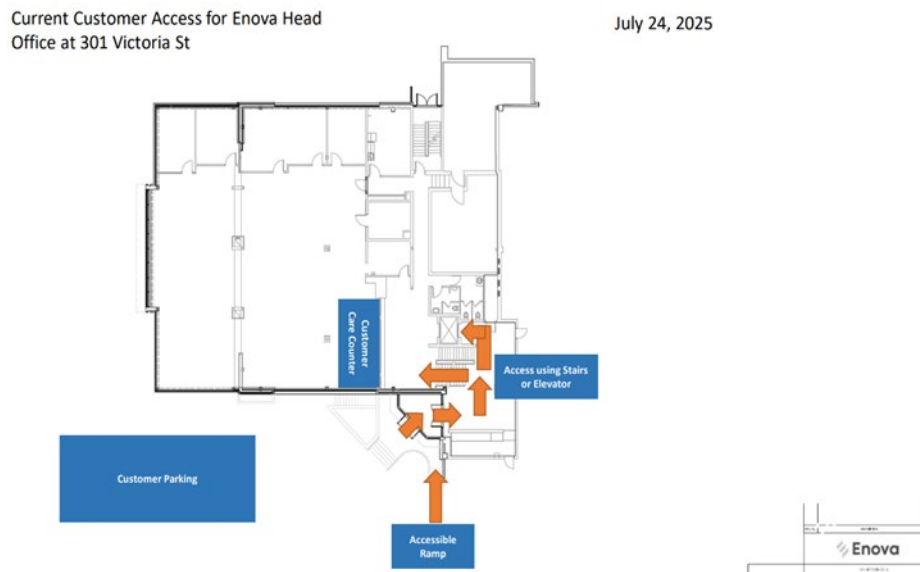
1 The Customer Care space, which serves as the primary point of contact for many of Enova Power's
2 customers, no longer reflects modern service expectations or accessibility standards. Similar to other
3 portions of the building's interior, the customer service centre has not undergone any meaningful update or
4 renovation in many years. As a result, the layout, furniture, lighting, and finishes are outdated and fail to
5 provide an inviting or professional environment. This lack of modernization impacts both customers and
6 employees. For customers, the current design presents barriers to accessibility, with limited
7 accommodation for individuals with mobility challenges, visual impairments, or other needs. The reception
8 and service areas are not configured to support privacy during transactions, which can create discomfort
9 for those discussing sensitive account or billing matters. In addition, the overall atmosphere is unappealing
10 and does not project the level of professionalism and care that Enova Power aims to provide.

11 For staff, the outdated space negatively affects morale and productivity. The customer service centre lacks
12 ergonomic workstations, sufficient lighting, and modern technology integration, all of which are essential for
13 efficient service delivery. Staff are expected to perform high-value customer-facing work in an environment
14 that does not support their needs or reflect the company's standards for employee well-being.

15 Remodeling the customer service centre would address these issues by creating a space that is accessible,
16 welcoming, and aligned with contemporary workplace and customer service design. Improvements are
17 planned to include barrier-free access, upgraded seating and service counters, private consultation areas,
18 enhanced lighting and acoustics, and the integration of modern digital tools to support seamless
19 transactions. These changes would not only improve the daily experiences of customers and employees
20 but also reinforce Enova Power's commitment to inclusivity, professionalism, and high-quality service.

21 The current physical layout of the customer service centre was constructed at a time when accessibility
22 was not fully integrated into the planning and design of commercial buildings. Figure 4 highlights the
23 present accessibility conditions of the customer service area.

2 At present, customers access the facility by first ascending an accessible ramp, which leads into a small
3 entrance foyer. However, the foyer is not level with the main floor of the customer service centre. As a
4 result, customers with accessibility needs must locate and use a small elevator to ascend and descend to
5 the service area. While functional, the location and signage of the elevator are not intuitive, creating
6 confusion and inconvenience for many visitors. Enova Power's staff have often been required to position
7 themselves in the foyer specifically to guide customers to the elevator, highlighting that the current design
8 unintentionally creates a barrier to independent and seamless access.

9 By contrast, customers without accessibility needs can walk directly into the customer service centre without
10 delay, making the elevator requirement an unnecessary additional step for those with mobility challenges.
11 Although the existing layout is technically compliant with legislated accessibility standards, Enova Power's
12 view is that compliance alone is insufficient. The company believes that accessibility should extend beyond
13 meeting minimum requirements to ensure a welcoming and equitable experience for all customers. Equal
14 and convenient access is essential for providing dignified service, and customers with accessibility needs
15 should not be subject to additional effort, uncertainty, or reliance on staff intervention simply to reach the
16 same service counter.

2.3. Facility Renovation Project Description

2.3.1. Project Scope

Enova Power has determined that the challenges associated with its Victoria St Property are best addressed through investment in a new HVAC system, comprehensive interior renovations, and improved accessibility to the customer service centre. The proposed plan aligns with Enova's five-year strategic goals, addresses operational inefficiencies, enhances employee satisfaction, and positions Enova for future success.

The most imminent challenge facing the Victoria Street Property is its aging HVAC system, and in particular the heightened risk of catastrophic system failure and business disruption. Initial design consultations regarding an HVAC upgrade revealed that in isolation, HVAC replacement would result in temporary relocation of staff and disruption to normal operations. Further, in isolation this work would require demolition of some interior office spaces, which would subsequently require repair. Under these circumstances, and in light of the other challenges noted at the Victoria Street Property, Enova Power determined the most efficient and cost-effective course of action was to complete required interior renovations at the same time. Performing the renovation with the HVAC upgrade is more cost effective and less disruptive, as it eliminates the need to displace employees more than once, and avoids interior space being demolished to facilitate the HVAC upgrade, repaired, and subsequently demolished or altered again as part of interior renovations. The same dynamic is true of accessibility upgrades to the customer service centre, wherein the separation of interior renovations from accessibility improvements would result in higher costs and more employee (and customer) disruption.

2.3.1.1. HVAC Upgrades

Enova Power's planned HVAC system upgrades include installing two systems in Victoria Street facility:

- The first system change is the installation of a new Air Source Variable Refrigerant Flow (VRF) and Dedicated Outside Air System with Energy Recovery systems throughout the three floors in the main office, and the two floors including the Metering workshop, Auditorium, trades offices and locker rooms.
- The second system change is converting the Stores Warehouse and Vehicle Storage Garage heating from natural gas-fired radiant tube heaters to overhead electric radiant heating.

Enova Power commissioned Walter-Fedy to produce a Level 2 Energy Audit for the Victoria Street Property. The objective of this engagement was to identify and analyze alternative holistic HVAC system retrofit scenarios that reduce GHG emissions and utility costs, and to recommend a preferred scenario through collaboration with Enova Power. The Energy Audit identified 26 energy efficiency measures and 6 clusters of complimentary solutions. Options ranged from capital expenditures of \$4.6M, on an Air Source Variable Refrigerant Flow cluster, to \$18.2M Comprehensive option.

2.3.1.2. Interior Renovations & Accessibility

A Space Planning Audit was performed to evaluate the new requirements of each department inhabiting the space. Several changes were evaluated, including a new accessible main customer entrance on the ground floor, the proximity of collaborative departments to improve workflow efficiency, and standard workstation dimensions for open workstations, private offices, and hoteling stations. Enova Power considered a ratio of employees to meeting room spaces and creating flexible meeting rooms using moveable dividers for less frequently required larger groups.

The interior renovation supports the workforce by changing the outdated design and infrastructure to an innovative and inviting work environment, prioritizing employee well-being and customers accessibility needs. This redesign is a crucial investment in efficiency, productivity, inclusivity and long-term sustainability of Enova Power.

2.4. Facility Renovation Financial Summary

The total project capital cost estimate is \$12.98M. The renovations began in Q2 2026, with an in-service date of Q2 2027. A breakdown of the Facility Renovation capital expenditures is provided below, and has been entered into the ICM models accompanying this application, separated into the categories of mechanical upgrades relating to the HVAC system, renovations relating to the updating of interior spaces, and additions relating to expansion of the facility by 1,500 square feet to accommodate customer accessibility renovations:

2.5. Options Analysis

In making its decision to pursue the most cost-effective option to meet operational needs, Enova Power completed an assessment of available facility renovation alternatives. Prior to examining detailed options for the renovation of the Victoria Street Property, Enova Power made two determinations:

- 1) Repatriating all Enova Power staff currently located at the head offices of its two legacy utilities into one of the existing facilities is not considered feasible due to space constraints and design limitations at both sites; and,

- 2) The sale of both the Victoria Street Property and the legacy Waterloo North Hydro buildings and the acquisition of a newly constructed facility was contemplated and dismissed on the basis of cost.

With the above two determinations made, a more discrete and detailed options analysis was completed specific to the renovation of the Victoria Street Property.

1. Option 1: Do Nothing

No improvements or changes would be made under this option other than continued HVAC system maintenance, which would maintain and increase the risk of HVAC system failure over time, compromise workplace safety, and negatively impact employee satisfaction. This option was not selected, as the replacement of the HVAC system is deemed necessary and urgent.

2. Option 2: HVAC Upgrade (Air-source VRF)

This option involves replacing the existing HVAC system in the Main and South offices with an air-source VRF system; an efficient and electrified solution that reduces reliance on fossil fuels and addresses end-of-life equipment issues. Radiant heating would also be installed in the warehouse and garage.

This option was not selected due to the additional benefits achievable by undertaking necessary interior renovations alongside the HVAC upgrade, which better aligns with Enova Power's long-term need and strategy. As previously noted, the HVAC replacement alone is unavoidable and would cause significant disruption. At the same time, the interior office renovation and accessibility needs at the Victoria Street Property would remain unaddressed in the immediate future under this option, which would require additional disruption in the near-term at incremental cost relative to a comprehensive project. Enova Power determined that undertaking other necessary facility upgrades at the same time was a prudent approach. This strategy minimizes overall disruption and productivity loss by consolidating disturbances into a single period, rather than facing repeated interruptions over multiple years.

3. Option 3: HVAC Upgrade (Air-source VRF), Interior Renovations and Customer Services Accessibility Expansion (1,500 sq. ft.) [PREFERRED OPTION]

This option is the preferred option, as described in this application. Under this option, the existing HVAC system would be replaced with an air-source VRF system in the Main and South offices, with radiant heating in the warehouse and garage. Interior renovations and a 1,500 square foot expansion of the customer

service area to improve accessibility will be completed concurrently. This option was selected as it represents the most cost-effective alternative, while delivering all necessary improvements to the Victoria Street Property.

4. Option 4: HVAC Upgrade (Air-source VRF), Interior Renovations and Customer Services Accessibility Expansion (3,000 sq. ft.)

Similar to Option 3, this option includes the air-source VRF HVAC system, radiant heating, and interior renovations, but expands the customer service accessibility area by 3,000 square feet. This option was not selected because the incremental costs outweighed the incremental benefits, making it a less prudent investment. Enova Power concluded it could accomplish its employee satisfaction, customer service, and accessibility needs with a small expansion of the customer service centre of 1,500 square feet; reducing capital expenditures and bill impacts for ratepayers.

5. Option 5: HVAC Upgrade (Comprehensive), Interior Renovations and Customer Services Accessibility Expansion (3,000 sq. ft.)

This option includes all elements of Option 4 but replaces the HVAC system with the Comprehensive cluster identified by Walter-Fedy. The Comprehensive cluster includes upgrading domestic hot water heaters to a ground-source heat pump, converting garage heating to electric radiant systems, and completing various other improvements (walls, roofs, windows, and doors upgrades). This option maximizes energy cost reductions at the Victoria Street Property, has the highest GHG reductions of any technical option analyzed, and would eliminate the use of natural gas in the facility.

This option was not selected due to the high capital cost of the Comprehensive cluster HVAC option. WalterFedy estimated the cost of the Comprehensive HVAC cluster to be \$18.2M; significantly greater than the cost of the air-source VRF option, while delivering minimal incremental GHG reductions.

1 The following table compares the five options identified across essential metrics of estimated costs⁵ and
2 outcomes:

4 **Recommended Option: HVAC Upgrade, Interior Renovation and Customer Service Accessibility**

5 On analysis of the 5 options described above, Enova Power concluded Option 3 is the most cost-effective
6 option. Option 3 meets all of Enova Power's most pressing needs with respect to the Victoria Street

Property, in an affordable manner with limited bill impacts for customers. This transformation is not only an aesthetic and functional improvement, but a crucial investment in the efficiency, productivity, and long-term sustainability of Enova Power.

2.6. Benchmarking

To assess the relative reasonableness and prudence of Enova Power's Facility Renovations, a benchmarking scan was completed to attempt comparison of the Victoria Street Property renovations to those of other distributors in Ontario in recent years. On completion of the scan, Enova Power's consultant Utilis Consulting Inc. concluded that relevant comparator data/metrics could not be obtained as the nature and scope of renovations reviewed differed significantly, preventing the completion of a meaningful benchmarking analysis. Table 4 shows the list of utilities and OEB proceeding records that were reviewed as part of the benchmarking scan.

2.7. Stakeholder Engagement

Enova Power engaged its Board of Directors and Shareholders as it advanced its analysis and recommendations to renovate the Victoria Street Property. The Board and Shareholders approved the

need to renovate/upgrade the existing facility. Enova Power conducted a project-specific customer survey, which was available online to customers from May to July 2026. The survey was distributed to residential customers with a sample size of 204. Around 62 percent of the respondents viewed the selected renovation plan favourably, with 68 percent indicated that they found the proposed bill increase acceptable.

3. Incremental Capital Module Eligibility

The OEB's ICM policy, as set out in the Report of the Board New Policy Options for the Funding of Capital Investments: The Advanced Capital Module, dated September 18, 2014 and the subsequent Report of the OEB New Policy Options for the Funding of Capital Investments: Supplemental Report (collectively referred to as the "ICM Report"), dated January 22, 2016, was established to address the treatment of a distributor's capital investment needs that arise during a Price Cap IR rate-setting plan which are incremental to a calculated materiality threshold.

In order to be eligible for incremental capital, an ICM claim must be incremental to a distributor's capital requirements within the context of its financial capacities underpinned by existing rates; and satisfy the eligibility criteria of materiality, need and prudence, as set out in the ICM Report and shown below:

Materiality	A capital budget will be deemed to be material, and as such reflect eligible projects, if it exceeds the OEB-defined materiality threshold. Minor expenditures in comparison to the overall capital budget should be considered ineligible for ACM or ICM treatment. A certain degree of project expenditure over and above the OEB-defined threshold calculation is expected to be absorbed within the total capital budget.
Need	The distributor must pass the Means Test (as defined in the ACM Report). Amounts must be based on discrete projects and should be directly related to the claimed driver. The amounts must be clearly outside of the base upon which the rates were derived.
Prudence	The amounts to be incurred must be prudent. This means that the distributor's decision to incur the amounts must represent the most cost-effective option (not necessarily least initial cost) for ratepayers.

3.1. Materiality

The ICM Report sets out two materiality tests: the Materiality Threshold and the Project-Specific Materiality Test:

1. **Materiality Threshold:** A capital budget will be deemed to be material, and as such reflect eligible projects, if it exceeds the Board-defined materiality threshold. Any incremental capital amounts approved for recovery must fit within the total eligible incremental capital amount (as defined in the OEB's ICM Report) and must clearly have a significant influence on the operation of the distributor; otherwise they should be dealt with at rebasing.
2. **Project Specific Materiality Test:** Minor expenditures in comparison to the overall capital budget should be considered ineligible for ICM treatment. A certain degree of project expenditure over and above the Board-defined threshold calculation is expected to be absorbed within the total capital budget.

3.1.1. Materiality Threshold and Maximum Eligible Incremental Capital

In order to determine the maximum eligible incremental capital which a distributor may seek recovery of in an ICM application, the applicant must first complete calculation of the Board-defined materiality threshold using the following formula:

$$\text{Threshold Value (\%)} = 1 + \left[\left(\frac{RB}{d} \right) \times (g + PCI \times (1 + g)) \right] \times ((1 + g) \times (1 + PCI))^n - 1 + 10\%$$

where:

RB = Approved rate base from the distributor's last CoS application.

d = Approved depreciation expense from the distributor's last CoS application.

g = Growth is calculated based on the percentage difference in distribution revenues between the most recent complete year and the distribution revenues from the most recent approved test year in a CoS application.

PCI = Price Cap Index (IPI stretch factor) of 3.0%, which in this application is equal to the OEB's published Inflation Factor for 2027 of 3.0%.

n = Number of years since the last rebasing.

Following the OEB's July 14, 2026 update to Chapter 3 of the Filing Requirements, distributors are required to use actual inflation factors over the historical period. However, the current OEB ICM models continue to operate using a single inflation factor input., as shown below:

In order to meet the OEB's guidance regarding actual inflation factors, while also maintaining compliance with the requirement to rely on the OEB's ICM model and utilize the rate-making functionality it provides, Enova has calculated Geomean averages of the applicable inflation factors for each of its Rate Zones to determine a single inflationary input into the OEB's ICM model.

Enova Power has completed the OEB's most recent ICM Model for each of the Kitchener-Wilmot Hydro and Waterloo North Hydro rate zones to determine the materiality thresholds for the 2027 rate year, as shown below.

Per the ICM Report, the materiality threshold must be compared against the total planned capital expenditures for the year in question. The total planned capital expenditures, less the materiality threshold, equal the maximum eligible incremental capital which may be sought for ICM recovery.

Enova is an integrated utility that manages its financial operations on a consolidated basis. However, for the purpose of this ICM application, the utility was required to allocate costs between the two rate zones. Accordingly, Enova allocated the total planned capital expenditures, project costs and related depreciation expense, and Capital Cost Allowance (CCA) based on the proportion of customers in each rate zone.

As noted, Enova Power has completed a DSP for its entire service territory (i.e. the KWRZ and WNRZ) attached to this application, which informs planned capital expenditures in 2027. The total planned capital expenditures in 2027 are \$78.7M.

The 2027 capital expenditure forecast was allocated 63.4% to KWRZ and 36.6% to WNRZ based on the percentage of customers in each rate zone. Using this cost allocation, the planned 2027 capital expenditures for the KWRZ and WNRZ are \$49.9M and \$28.8M, respectively.

Utilizing the figures above, Enova Power has calculated the maximum eligible incremental capital for each rate zone, and determined that 100% of the Facility Renovation is eligible for incremental funding in accordance with the materiality threshold test, as demonstrated below:

3.1.2. Project Specific Materiality

At a capital cost of \$12.98M, the Facility Renovation represents a one-time expenditure that increases Enova Power's planned 2027 capital expenditures by approximately 16.5% or 80% General Plant. This cannot be effectively paced over a longer period of time, nor can it be used to offset or defer other necessary capital investments. Enova Power submits that the Facility Renovation is clearly not a minor expenditure as referenced in the ICM Report. Further, as described in section 2 above, the Facility Renovation is an

important and foundational investment, that will have a significant influence on the operations of the utility now and in the future.

Enova Power submits that the Facility Renovation passes the project specific materiality test.

3.2. Need

In order to qualify for ICM funding, a distributor must demonstrate that there is a need for the incremental funding. The ICM Report requires a three-fold test to demonstrate need:

1. The distributor must pass the Means Test.
2. Amounts must be based on discrete projects and should be directly related to the claimed driver.
3. The amounts must be clearly outside of the base upon which rates were derived.

3.2.1.Means Test

If a distributor's most recently available regulated return on equity ("ROE") exceeds 300 basis points above the deemed ROE embedded in the distributor's rates, then funding for any incremental capital project would not be allowed. In Enova Power's case, the appropriate value for comparison is a blended deemed ROE between the KWRZ and WNRZ, weighted by rate base at the time of MAADs approval. On this basis, the following table presents Enova Power's completion of the Means Test:

Enova Power meets the OEB's Means Test for ICM eligibility.

3.2.2.Discrete Project Unfunded through Rates

As described in Section 2 above, the Facility Renovation is a discrete capital project that is not part of an ongoing capital program and is not funded through existing distribution rates. Given the investment's significant, one-time, and foundational nature for the utility, Enova Power submits that the project satisfies Parts 2 and 3 of the OEB's Need Test for ICM eligibility.

3.3. Prudence

To satisfy the criteria of prudence, a distributor needs to establish that the incremental capital amount it proposes to incur is prudent. To satisfy the “prudence test”, a distributor must demonstrate that its decision to incur the incremental capital represents the most cost-effective option for its customers (though, not necessarily the least cost option).

As further described in section 2.5 above, Enova Power completed an Options Analysis to meet its facility needs and has concluded that the HVAC Upgrade (Air-source VRF), Interior Renovations and Customer Services Accessibility Expansion (Option 3) represent the most cost-effective option for ratepayers.

In additional demonstration of prudence, Enova Power engaged Walter-Fedy to prepare a Level 2 Energy Audit for the Victoria Street Property to identify and analyze alternative holistic HVAC system retrofit scenarios that reduce GHG emissions and utility costs, and to recommend a preferred scenario through collaboration with Enova Power. Similarly, a Space Planning Audit was completed to assess in detail the amount of interior space required per employee to guide the optimal design of Enova Power’s interior renovations. Enova Power submits that the proposed renovations to the Victoria Street Property are functional and appropriate for the current needs of Enova Power.

Enova Power undertook a procurement process to ensure that project costs were competitively assessed and managed.

- Swing Space Tender: The Invitation to Tender began on October 8, 2025, and was completed on October 22, 2025. A total of 150 vendors/subcontractors were invited to participate in the procurement process.
- Main Renovation Tender: Invitation to Tender was sent out on March 20, 2026 and closed on April 9, 2026. A total of 280 vendors / subcontractors were invited to participate in the procurement process.

The process was managed by AEC Developments. Following the evaluation process, Enova Power selected the successful proponent based on the overall value provided, cost efficiency, and the proponent’s ability to meet the project requirements. The selected proponent was then used to develop the project budget.

Enova Power submits that it has passed the OEB's Prudence Test for the purpose of ICM eligibility.

4. ICM Financial Implications

4.1. Half-Year Rule, Capital Cost Allowance and PILs

The Half-Year Rule is not applicable in this case as the Facility Renovation in-service year (2027) does not coincide with the final year of Enova Power's IRM term (currently planned for 2033).

Enova Power notes that it has not reflected the recent changes to Capital Cost Allowance tax rules, resulting from Bill C-97, in its ICM calculations. Consistent with the OEB's letter of July 25, 2019, Enova Power intends to book any impacts of the CCA rule changes in account 1592-PILS and Tax Variances for this and all other affected capital additions.

4.2. Derivation of ICM Rate Riders

Enova Power is seeking OEB approval of the ICM rate riders identified in this section to recover the incremental capital-related revenue requirement associated with the Facility Renovation. The following table depicts the incremental revenue requirement, as calculated in the KWRZ and WNRZ ICM models attached to this application.

Although the Victoria Street facility is physically located within the Kitchener-Wilmot Rate Zone (KWRZ), it serves as Enova Power's primary corporate and operational headquarters supporting both the KWRZ and the Waterloo North Rate Zone (WNRZ). The facility houses corporate and shared service functions that provide support across Enova's entire distribution system, including executive leadership, finance, regulatory affairs, partial engineering, system planning, operations management, customer service, human resources, asset management, procurement, health and safety, and other administrative functions. Staff located at the facility are responsible for planning, operating, maintaining, and supporting the distribution systems and customers in both rate zones.

Enova Power proposes the ICM rate riders above be made effective January 1, 2027, and continue in rates through to Enova Power's next re-basing, planned for 2033 rates.

4.3. Deferral and Variance Accounts

Enova Power requests Board approval to record amounts relating to the Facility Renovation in the applicable 1508 sub-accounts pertaining to ICM projects, with the intention of bringing forward ICM amounts for inclusion in rate base at the utility's next cost of service proceeding. Enova Power will follow the accounting treatment for deferral and variance accounts as described in the Accounting Procedures Handbook and the ICM Report.

4.4. Bill Impacts

The incremental bill impacts of the ICM rate riders (i.e. ICM bill impacts exclusive of any other component of Enova Power's 2027 IRM application) for each of Enova Power's rate zones are presented below:
